The Service to America Committee focus is to capture the volunteer service. A uniform mechanism was created to capture members' service. This mechanism is the On-Line Tally on the NSDAR website. This site monitors the progress toward achieving the Ann Turner Dillon Administration goal of 19,000,000 volunteer hours to be recorded by June 30, 2019.

IB. A CHAPTER ACTIVITY RECORD: A chapter representative enters cumulative hours for service provided by members of a chapter. The representative logs into the Tally site using their own information. However, at the "Who Participated", she will select "My Chapter." (For example, ten members read to seniors at a community center for one hour. The total hours for the service are ten hours. These hours are not assigned to one person rather to the chapter.) Only one Chapter member enters this activity.

After logging the volunteer service detail click "**Save Activity.**"

If you perform a service repetitively, you may use the "To view hours you've submitted ..." (This narrative is AFTER signing in to report service hours.) This website link takes you to the *Recently Recorded Volunteer Hours* screen where you may "duplicate for another date."

2. SERVICE HOURS RECOGNIZED THROUGH ON-LINE TALLY; NO LONGER ON CHAPTER MASTER REPORT

This year the On-Line Tally will document your Chapter's service hours. They will NOT be reflected in the Chapter Master Report. ***Chapters will receive credit ONLY for the hours recorded through On-Line Tally.*** Members are encouraged to enter hours throughout the year.

3. MEANINGFUL COMMUNITY SERVICE EXPANDED AS OF FEBRUARY 1, 2017:

Meaningful Community Service has been expanded to include additional DAR activities, e.g. preparing a chapter program, attending district meeting. Some examples of chapter work that is NOT acceptable as community service is:

- Attending DAR club meetings with no DAR work involved
- All travel to and from service projects and DAR meetings/events/etc.
- Making individual monetary contributions without any active service
- Participating in DAR webinars

Consult the NSDAR website, *Service to America Committee, Meaningful Community Service* for additional specifics.

Be advised that periodic review of all logged hours will take place by Chapter Regents and State Chairmen. If there is duplication of hours or hours do not fall within the definition of "meaningful community service," they can be removed.

4. QUANTIFICATION AND MONITORING OF 19,000,000 HOURS GOAL:

Each chapter can determine their respective cumulative goal for NSDAR to attain the 19,000,000 volunteer hours. Currently NSDAR has approximately 183,000 members. The pro rata volunteer hours per member would be 104 hours. Chapters may calculate their total as the 104 hours multiplied by number of members.

Please Note: For year ended December 31, 2016, ISDAR had 100% Chapter On-line Tally participation. The Iowa Service to America Co-Chairs applaud this excellent accomplishment.)

7. "SHARING" FOCUS:

Although NSDAR encourages sharing the individual sharing stories via the National Chair, Regional Vice Chair, Today's DAR Blog, and DAR Face book page, the Iowa Co-chairs recognize that "sharing" chapter and ISDAR members service via local media is as important. *Local sharing supports the goal of promoting DAR as a relevant and dynamic organization.*

Other documentations to satisfy compliance are the DAR Photo/Video Release Form and Online Guidelines. Initially compliance may seem onerous and unnecessary. However, as State Co-chairs, we encourage you to recognize current privacy and identity theft concerns. NSDAR website links as of October, 2017 are provided.
